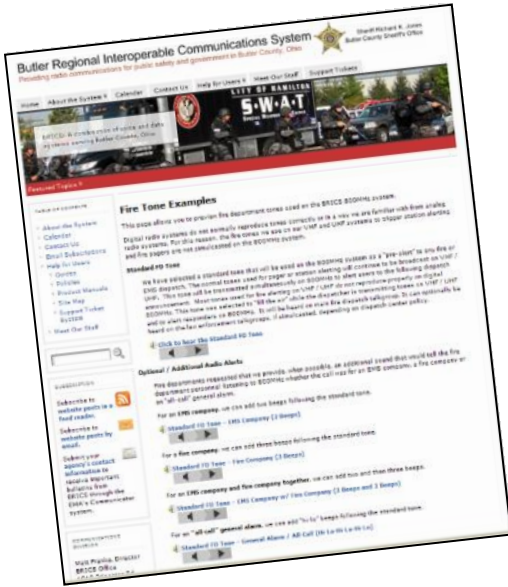

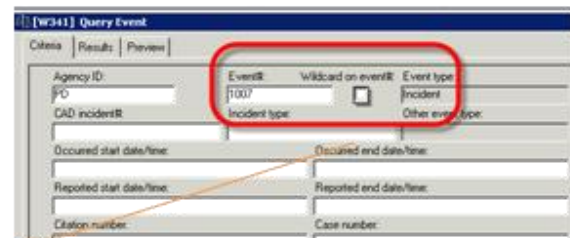

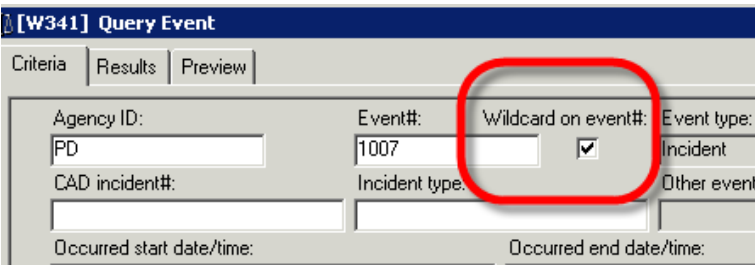

Without the box being checked you will receive this message.



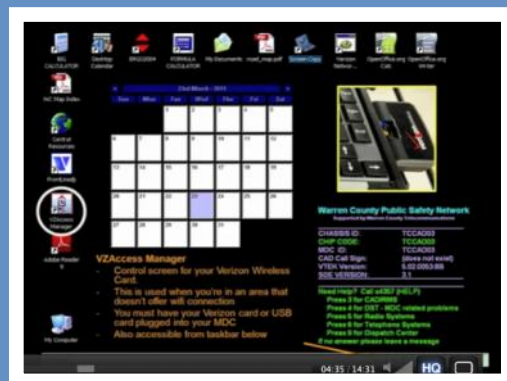

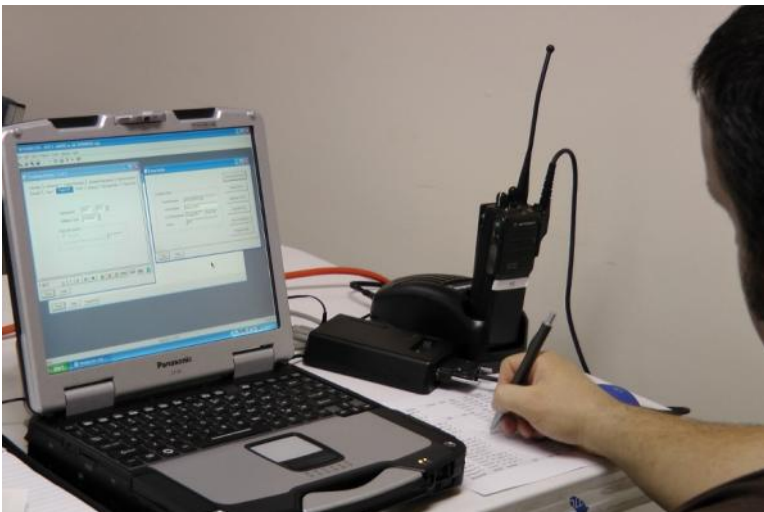

## Rebanding Continues

Radio Techs, Glenn McKeehan & Nick Yeazel, are hard at work getting all 3000+ portable radios through the first phase of rebanding. **Step 1** 'flash' the radios and program them with rebanded talkgroups. These talkgroups will go live during **Step 2** when we make the switch to our new, rebanded frequency.



The inside of your radio should have this sticker if it's been through Step 1.



## TAC Channels Help You & Dispatch

Every Fire, Law, & EMS radio contains (or will contain after rebanding) TAC2-TAC13. These tactical talkgroups are assigned exclusively by the Dispatch Center. Unlike in the past, **Police, Fire and EMS can now communicate directly with each other on TAC channels** - often removing Dispatch as the messenger - allowing you to handle an incident with fewer delays and communication gaps.

Structure fires, searches, vehicle crashes, HazMat spills, or any other incident requiring multiple agencies are occasions to use a TAC channel. Questions typically relayed through dispatch will have already been answered by communicating directly with command on a TAC channel.

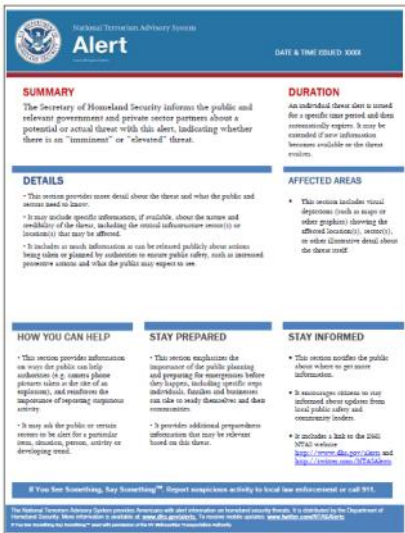

## EMA's Matt Haverkos at Fire Chiefs Meeting

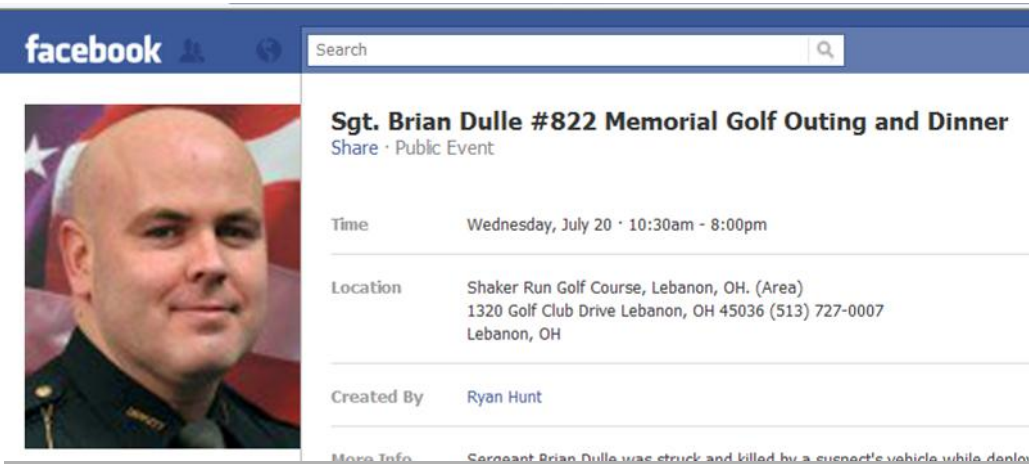
Matt Haverkos, the L.E.P.C. Information Coordinator with Warren County Emergency Services, gave a presentation on the Mission of the Warren County Local Emergency Planning Committee. The Committee is a group of local, state, and federal officials who are established by Ohio Revised Code 3750 to plan and prepare for incidents involving hazardous materials in the County. The L.E.P.C. is responsible for S.A.R.A. Title III chemical facility reporting and enforcement as pertinent to the "Community Right to Know Act." The L.E.P.C. partners with government and industry to reduce the effects of hazardous materials incidents on industry, first responders, and the general public. Some primary functions of the L.E.P.C.



- Creating and maintaining the County-wide Hazardous Materials Plan as it fits in the Emergency Operations Plan.
- Maintaining the Community Right to Know Program for the general public as well as first responders through the CAMEO System.
- Coordinating a Training and Exercise Program consistent with the Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program.

- Serving as the threat and risk assessment team as outlined by the Department of Homeland Security. This involves maintaining the State Homeland Security Grant.

## Wayne Twp Reunites with Grateful Crash Survivor

On May 23, 2009, Greg "Bikeman" Wheeler traveled from Michigan to Warren County for his favorite past time - bicycling. Not uncommon for his 100+ mile rides to outlast the sun, he equipped his bike with front and rear safety lights. But all his safety efforts couldn't avoid a speeding ATV on this non-motorized bicycle path. Operated by a father and 18-year old daughter, the ATV plowed into Wheeler nearly head on, catapulting him into a ditch with 11 broken bones.

### The consequences

- The girl is reportedly in assisted living with permanent brain damage.
- Wheeler spent 7 weeks in various hospitals with doctors wondering if he would be able to walk normally, return to work, or ride a bike again.
- Greg suffered a broken right thumb, three ribs, jaw, left elbow, left leg (femur in two places), and multiple fractures in the pelvic bone.
- He lost all memory from the accident through his first week in the hospital.
- Wheeler was out of full-time work until December, a machining job his employer thankfully kept open for him.
- A mangled state-of-the-art bicycle.

A positive outcome of this accident is Wheeler's newfound appreciation for Public Safety Workers. He arranged this most recent reunion with Wayne Township to shake hands with those who shined light on his darkest moment. "I have a whole new level of appreciation for people in our fire department/first responder positions, and for our police force. I often stop when I see them around and tell them thanks for being there... Now I realize more than ever before: where would we be without them! Once again, Thanks so much to the Wayne Township Fire Department for having the people in place, fully trained, and prepared to handle a severe crash victim laying in a ditch like I was

*just two years ago. To anyone reading this, I would like to say: If you are riding your bicycle on a Non-Motorized bicycle path, and you suddenly see an All Terrain Vehicle coming right at you, it would be a really good time for you to know that Jesus Christ is watching over you. MANY, MANY THANKS to Him. - Greg "Bikeman"*

## Deerfield Firefighters Save Teen from Floodwaters

Logan Cittadino said he tried to cross the flooded creek with his bicycle when he lost his balance... The 13-year-old grabbed a branch and held on for his life. "I was sitting there praying to God that I would get out of this." His prayers turned into screams for help, and some Deerfield Township firefighters came to his rescue after a neighbor heard the eighth-grader's cries. "It was just barely a tree that he was hanging on," said Lt. Patrick Strausbaugh of Deerfield Township Fire Department.



Firefighters rappelled 50 feet through darkness and heavy brush to reach the teen. Cittadino had been hanging onto the branch for about an hour when firefighters reached him. The teen suffered only some cuts and bruises during the ordeal, but his mother is still shaken. "He could've died," said Karen Cittadino. "I could've been ID'ing his body last night."

In the words of Chief Greatorex, "We are recognizing them as they poured the foundation for the fire rescue service we have today."



## Mass Casualty Trailer for all Agencies

**Ever wonder what rolls up to a Mass Casualty Incident? This guy!**

A 100-person Mass Casualty Trailer equipped with:

- A truck hitched and ready to tow
- John Deere Gator with med bed
- Treatment room (or command room) with cabinets, dry erase board, folding tables, and medical supplies.
- Compartments around the entire perimeter storing everything from bandages to body boards, oxygen tanks to tarps, etc.
- Exterior lighting for night incidents, canopy for rainy conditions and shade.



JEMS also has a 100-person mass casualty trailer and Lebanon houses a Mass Decontamination Unit. In addition, the Warren County Fire Chiefs Association operates (2) 50-person mass casualty trailers, stored at Station 52 in Mason and JEMS.

This resource was obtained through a Homeland Security grant, paid for by the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP), for use by the Cincinnati region.

While the vehicle is titled to Deerfield Township Fire Rescue, the agency agreed to take this anywhere requested along with Engine 58 and a staffed car. While the anticipated destination will be our general area, it will go nationwide if requested / needed.

Randy is very **dedicated to educating his community** and the next generation of EMS providers. He has volunteered with the Injury Prevention Program at Bethesda North called Think First... a "Mocktail" event to promote the offering of non-alcoholic beverages at social gatherings as a way to **prevent drunk driving**. Randy is a BLS instructor and has taught many CPR classes for his hometown of Sharonville, Ohio.

Randy is viewed as **an expert on all issues related to EMS** and is often sought out by hospital staff for this expertise. Randy is **the epitome of professionalism** in EMS. He was the keynote speaker for Bethesda North's Paramedic Program graduation ceremony last year. I remember specifically a story about a "frequent flyer" mentally impaired patient who often called 911 late at night for minor issues. Randy **took the extra time to gain this patient's trust** and learn that the real reason she kept calling was because she was lonely and afraid. Randy helped get social services involved and lobbied the right resources to address the true needs of this patient. He **felt so much compassion** for this lady that he got choked up during his speech as he described what it felt like to know how much he had helped to improve her life. Wow... We collaborated on a lecture called "Full-immersion Simulation, Using Realism to Promote Critical Thinking" that we presented at the 2010 NAEMSE Symposium in Schaumburg, Illinois.

As a member of the Federal KY-1 DMAT, Johann was deployed last winter to St. Thomas to administer flu shots to school children on the island. **He truly exemplifies dedication to excellence and service** to the community and I highly recommend him for Ohio Paramedic of the Year.

The Warren County Amateur Radio Association (WCARA) consists of licensed radio operators who have voluntarily registered their qualifications and equipment for communications duty in the public service when disaster strikes.

While the primary activity of the Warren County Amateur Radio Association is to provide emergency communications during disasters, WCARA also provides essential communications for public events including parades, marathons and other races, walkathons, bicycle tours, and other large events where swift, reliable communications can protect and improve the safety of the general public.

In recent years the Warren County Amateur Radio Association (WCARA) has handled dozens of severe weather spotter nets and several activations for disaster assessment after weather events, including a tornado touchdown.

Volunteers are provided with training in many aspects of emergency communications, weather spotting, damage assessment, emergency management, first aid, and CPR.

Volunteers are dubbed amateur only in that they do not receive financial compensation for work performed.

We are always on the lookout for operators, new and old. If you are interested in volunteering, contact us by telephone or join us during our weekly training net. All are welcome.
