


# Download your 2012 Bingo Map from the FTP Site

Visit http://ftp.wcoh.net/public/User\_Information/Maps/ and download WC\_Maps\_4-2012.zip.

What is the bingo map? It's a hyperlinked map of Warren County that you can use to zone in on a smaller region of the county, showing back roads, hydrants, jurisdictional boundaries, waterways, etc. It is loaded onto the desktop of MDC's and can be used on any computer. You must download the entire zipped file so that the linked files stay together.

### CAD/RMS MEMO

TO: All County, Public Works, and Public Safety Agencies

RE: Emergin CAD paging system failure

On Thursday, May 24th, the server that hosts Emergin CAD Paging, suffered an operating system failure. This is equivalent to windows crashing on your home or work computer. The Emergin vendor had cut off all support for this product making it almost impossible to recover this system. Data Systems have exhausted all means to recover the operating system on this server with no luck.

**Until further notice, you will not receive manual or automatic CAD incident pages.** For dispatch, this means the TN function in CAD is not available. The automatic toning feature is not affected by this failure and will continue to work. Dispatch still has the PageGate paging program at the supervisor's desk and still has the ability to manually page personnel through that program.

We have purchased a new paging program to replace both Emergin and PageGate but we are several weeks away from being able to implement this new paging program. This project has been accelerated due to the failure of Emergin but will still be several weeks out before it can be put in service due to vendor schedules. The new system has backups to prevent a complete failure from happening in the future.

### NEED A K-9 UNIT?

Jason Lagore has been

a Park Officer for nearly 7 years at Caesar Creek. His dog and partner is a 3-year old Yellow Labrador Retriever named "Ranger". They are stationed at Lake Milton responsible for covering Caesar's Creek and Cowan Lake state parks, as well as all state parks in Southwest Ohio. He is a great addition not only Lagore recounts, "I knew the to Ohio State Parks, but can also be utilized by Warren County's Police first time that I went to K-9 Agencies.

#### **Training**

Lagore and Ranger were trained by Steve Dunham (City of Franklin K-9 I have learned in these few Officer) with Police Dog Services LLC in Germantown where they completed a 240-hour basic K-9 school. They also have a state certification in narcotics, tracking, and article searches.

#### Ranger's Abilities

- Track people without risk of the victim getting bit.
- Passively alert on the odors of illegal narcotics such as Cocaine, Heroin, Methamphetamines, and Marijuana, and their derivatives.
- Article and area searches.
- Passively alert on the odors of human remains.

According to Lagore, "Ranger and I have been working the road since January 8th 2012. We train 32 hours per month with our program being run solely by donations."

Caesar Creek has had Police K-9s since 1996 when Sgt. John Patrick in 2002. John's next dog was Yogi who retired with John in 2008.

At one time the division had up to four dogs throughout the state, but

currently there are only two remaining - Lagore and Park Officer Chuck Stout State Park.



- 4. Evaluate personal leadership experiences along with lessons learned and apply in the real world of their own organizations.




