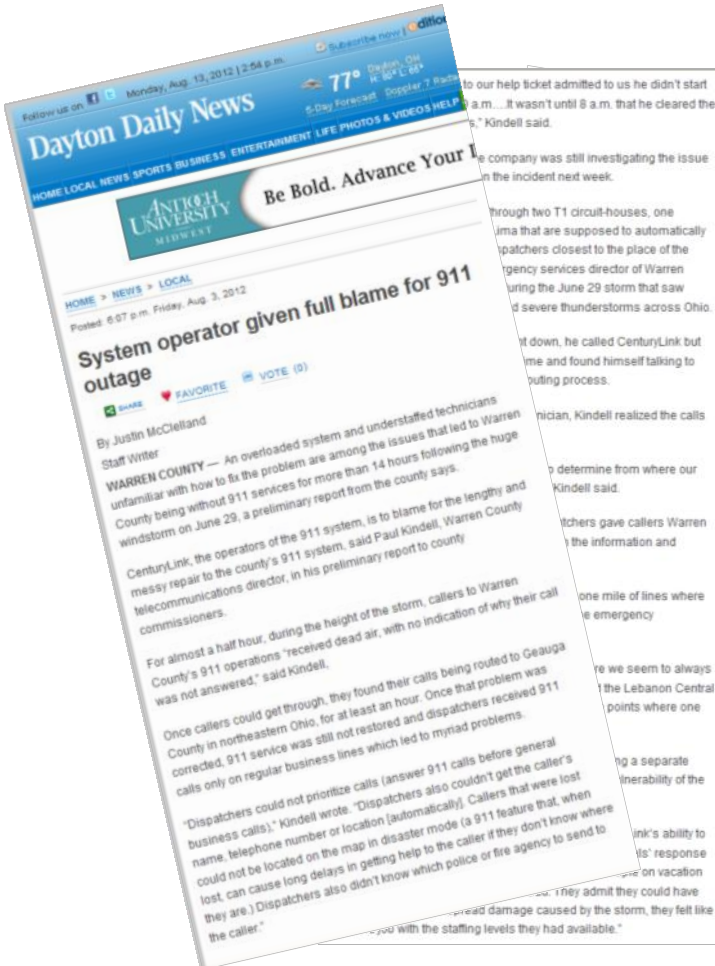

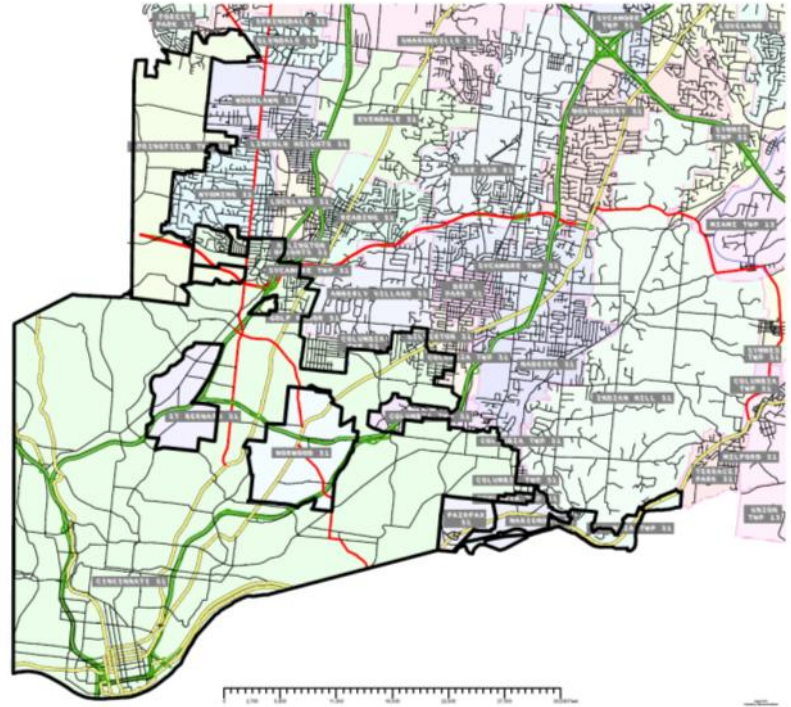

- Large portion of Hamilton County added to cover down to City of Cincinnati. This will allow entry of hospitals and other common places in that area.
- Parcel data for Hamilton County updated and includes the new area.
- Aerial photography for new Hamilton County area. (from 2010 and low resolution, working to get better.)
- 165 dams based upon the state's list have been entered as common places. None have an address since they are not necessarily close to a roadway. All have the 24 hour Dam Emergency phone number in them.
- Texas Eastern features have been added to the Building layer. If it is too much or not enough detail, let me know.
- New naming method for divided highway entrance/exit ramps. I did this in the new Hamilton County area for testing and review.

[Street name] "Ramp" ["to" or "from"] [divided highway] - e.g. "TOWNE ST RAMP FROM I75 NB". All new ramps have the same ranges: 1-9 and 2-10. The low end is the southern or western end of the ramp. 5 would put it in the middle of the ramp. This way you don't need to know mile markers to locate/enter a ramp.
- For both the new section of Hamilton County and the very north of our mapping, only 'major' streets are included. Basically, WC's map was compared with Google maps and we used the streets that they have entered in yellow. On the north end, streets not in yellow (10,000) were removed. It is very remote that we would receive a call for a location that far from the county, so the streets were removed to maintain performance. Any street can be added again and will be added if a common place is needed.
- Four new agencies have been added to CAD and the map: Human Services (HS), Norwood Police (NO), Norwood Fire (NO), and St Bernard (SB).
- Data gathering process for Brown County has begun - not sure if or when it will get added to the map.
- Two changes in (2) major street names. Foster is now 'Fosters' in E/W FOSTERS-MAINEVILLE RD & SOCIALVILLE-FOSTERS RD.



Governor's Administration visited Warren County & Recognized Telecom's New Radio System

Warren County welcomed more than 55 guests on August 7th to learn about the collaboration between Telecom and the Ohio MARCS radio system. Organized by Telecom Trainer, Allison Lyons and featuring our very own director, Paul Kindell on the speaker list, the history of Telecom's entry in the radio system business was outlined with the future also laid out for all to understand. Paul did a great job of representing Telecom and the interest of the public safety agencies that we serve. Other speakers included Commissioner Dave Young, Randy Cole (State Controlling Board President & Policy Advisor, OBM), Darryl Anderson (Ohio MARCS Program Director), Mike Bunner (Emergency Services Director), and Stu Davis -(State Chief Information Officer and Assistant Director of DAS).

The state is very excited to partner with Warren County as they gain access to our existing 7 towers while we gain access to 2 of their towers which perfectly fill existing gaps in our coverage area. Warren County subscribers will also see seamless roaming when they leave the County borders as they will then operate on the MARCS network of towers. Commissioner Young beside Stu Davis signed the Memorandum of Understanding that put the collaboration in ink.

Expect to see the effects of this collaboration in 2013 when we switch to the digital system!

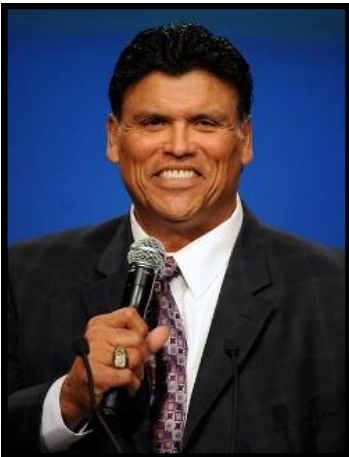

Keep Highly Concentrated Packets of Laundry Detergent Locked Up and Out of the Reach of Kids

If you use highly concentrated liquid laundry detergent that comes in small packets, you'll want to heed this warning from the experts at America's 57 poison centers: Always keep them locked up high and out of the reach of kids!

These new laundry packets dissolve in the washing machine. Because they are colorful and squishy, they are attractive to children. They can look like candy or something fun to play with. But some young children who have put these small packets into their mouths and swallowed some of the detergent have become very ill and have been hospitalized. Others have gotten it into their eyes, causing severe irritation.

Poison centers receive many calls each year about children getting into laundry detergent. Usually, swallowing laundry detergent causes mild stomach upset or even no symptoms. Poison center experts say the new laundry packets seem to be different. Some children exposed to them experience excessive vomiting, wheezing and gasping. Some get very sleepy. Some even have had trouble breathing and have needed a ventilator to help them breathe.

The experts at your local poison center urge parents and caregivers to:

- Always keep detergents locked up, high, and out of the reach of children.
- Follow the instructions on the product label.
- Call your local poison center at 1-800-222-1222 **immediately** if you think a child has been exposed to a packet of highly concentrated liquid laundry detergent.
