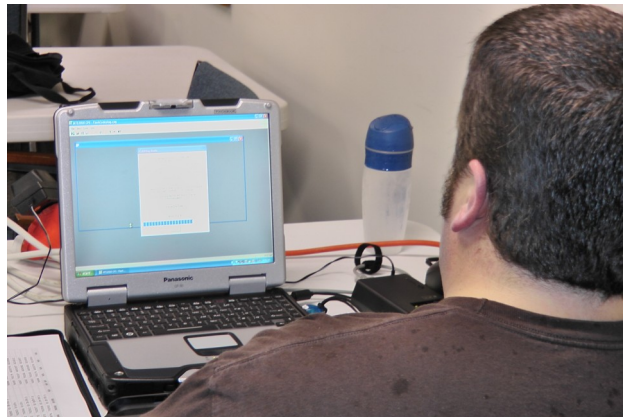

1. Removal of pre-rebanded 8iTACs and 8iCALL.

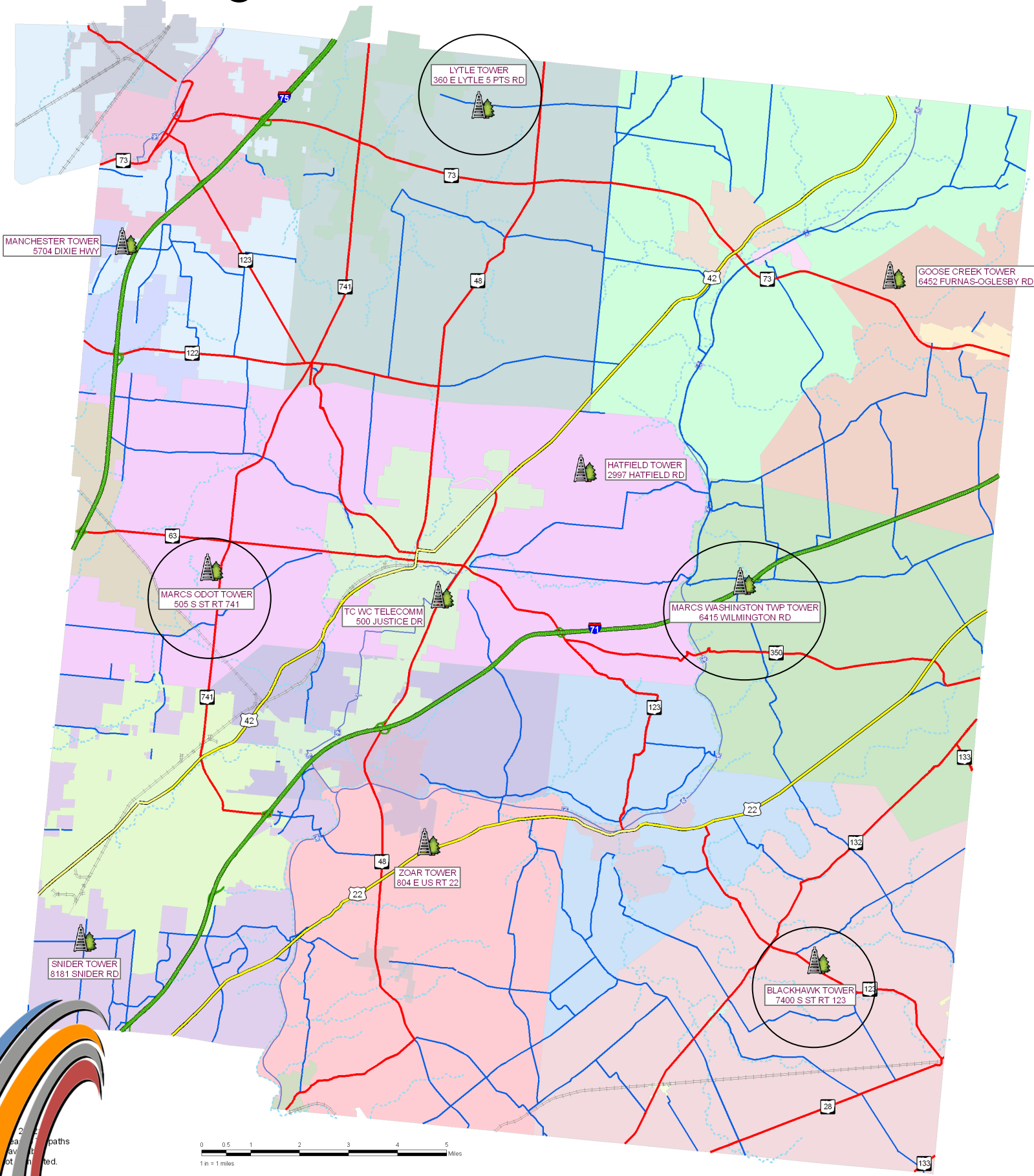

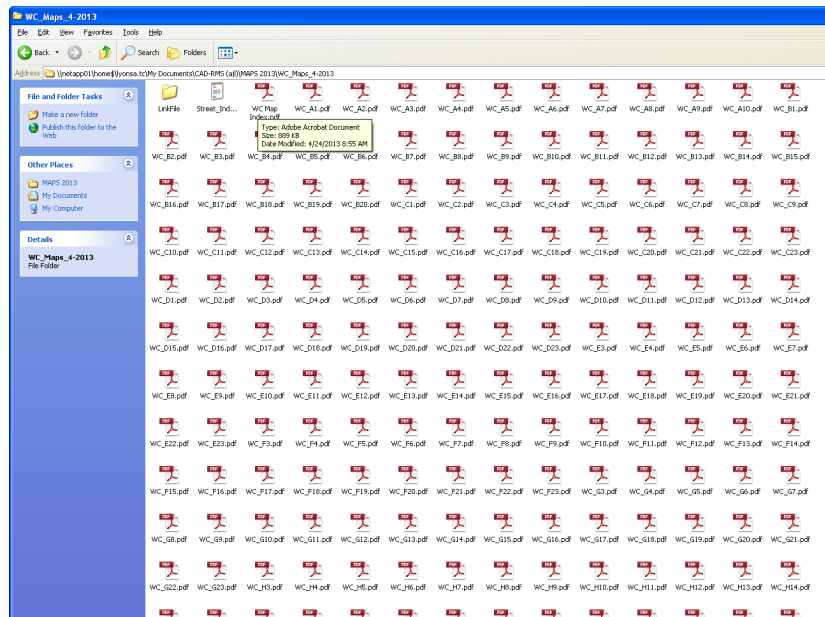
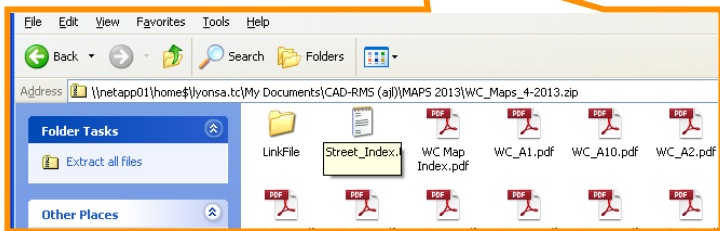
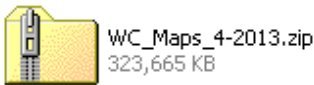
Step 2: Click the 'WC_Maps_4-2013.zip' hyperlink to open this dialogue box.

Step 4: Once saved, double click the zipped folder, then under the 'Folder Tasks' sidebar, click 'Extract all files' and follow the prompts.

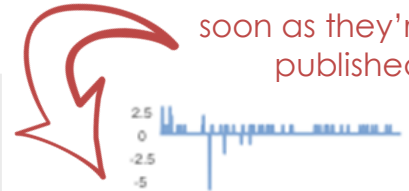
