SCHOOLS: TEST YOUR EMERGENCY BUTTON IN MARCH!



All school administrators were sent a month-long calendar event to remind them of this testing window. Within that event are the easy step-by-step instructions, also outlined in the 'Testing Instructions' word

document distributed to all school personnel. All schools who utilize a MARCS-in-Schools Emergency Button radio on the Warren County Radio System are required to test their emergency button twice per school year, per the Memorandum of Understanding. This is the final test of the school year while most schools are on Spring Break;

Testing the button ensures 2 major things:

- 1) The radio is functional and properly linked to the Communications Center, displaying its alias and operating on the correct talkgroup;
- 2) The school knows the proper procedure to activate the emergency alarm, utilize the 10-second open mic, then follow the Push-to-Talk / Release-to-Listen format.

LAW ENFORCEMENT: HOW TO RADIO THE WCSO JAIL SALLYPORT

Long-time users of the Warren County radio system remember having SALLYPORT in their radios. The same frequency is still in your radio - 8TAC94D! When transporting an inmate or citizen to the WCSO Jail, you can communicate to Jail Control via this frequency when pulling into the Sheriff's Office lot. It is a direct radio-to-radio frequency so you must be in close proximity to the jail for them to hear you.

8TAC94 is located in ZONE D for all law enforcement agencies.




Data Systems Lingo + Troubleshooting Tips





Additionally, each vendor held a tech session with Telecom to discuss the nuts and bolts of their system, how it would integrate into the County, and other non-end user details.

On February 25th, County personnel gathered again to conduct a final ranking of the vendors using a weighted scoring method corresponding with the RFP terms. That preferred vendor will be announced soon as we progress with this project.

Statewide Roaming in Action

On January 30, Deerfield Twp Fire's Battalion Chief Wehmeyer was returning home from a deployment in Maryland. As he crossed the Pennsylvania-Ohio border, he decided to test the radio's claimed 'Statewide Roaming'. CAD/RMS Manager Paul Bernard met him on Fire Hailing, and sure enough, **they communicated while 200 miles apart!** This would have remained a fun experiment except that, during their conversation, an incident occurred in Clinton County that requested Warren County's Technical Rescue team. Wehmeyer further tested the digital system asking if he could somehow monitor that talkgroup. In less than a minute, the Communications Center patched Fire Hailing to the assigned incident talkgroup, allowing him to listen to its progress while still 3 hours away from home... **this is our digital system AT WORK!**









Telecom Renovation Continues

It was all hands on deck! The former Dispatch Center-turned-storage room is finally getting decluttered for its transformation into Data Systems' new space.
