We Hosted A Pursuit Communications Tabletop Exercise On September 21st, reps from Butler

Co., Montgomery Co., Dayton PD, Warren Co. Communications, Hamilton Co. Communications, OSP Lebanon Post, and Telecom gathered review the SOSINK Pursuit Communications Plan and to tabletop a couple scenarios:

#1: Bank Robbery with shots fired near I-71 with suspect heading westbound on I-275. The attendees walked through the logistics of who had jurisdiction, which talkgroup to start on, what to patch from whose radio console, radio announcements and restrictions, what neighboring Comm Centers would tell their units in preparation if the pursuit entered their community, communications center hand-offs.

#2: Car stolen at gas station near Dayton Mall with a child in the backseat heading SB on 741. It was noticeable that a pursuit on an interstate is handled differently than one on a local road.

Next Steps:

- 1st week of October: Reconvene with each rep at their own PSAP on a phone conference bridge, running through the scenarios, confirming steps and revealing is-
- 2nd week of October: Hot Wash at Warren County Telecom
- October 25: SIEC Meeting our self-imposed deadline to have our act together.
- November: counties train their dispatchers and communicate to units
- 1st week of Dec: Functional drills at various times of day to involve different shifts.

Unit and Station Cross Staffing (contributed by Joshua Moyer)

With TriTech CAD we now have the option to not only cross staff individual units but also cross staff all units in a station with a set crew level.

For Unit Cross Staffing, we can now cross staff multiple units instead of just two. So if you have one crew for 3 vehicles, this is the option we will use and once one of the vehicles is dispatched, the other two vehicles are put out of service until the dispatched vehicle (and crew) is back in guarters.

For Station Cross Staffing, you have the option to set how many crews are at the station. Each crew accounts for one vehicle. So if you have an Engine, Medic and Rescue in a station and your crew count is set to 2, once 2 Vehicles are on a call (Example the Engine and Medic) the third vehicle (Rescue) will be placed Out of Service (OOS) until the dispatched units are back in quarters. When considering this option we should set this up according to how the station operates under normal circumstances.



- Normal does not update with position of your vehicle. Use it to track several vehicles at the zoom level of your choice.
- Vehicle Tracks your vehicle. Map orientation stays looking north.
- Heading Tracks vehicle with 'driver's view' like your phone.
- Auto Zoom Shows your location, your incident location, and the quickest route. Auto -zooms as you near your incident with layers appearing as their zoom range occurs.

 Diesel single phase.

Warren County Phone/Tablet Charger Hot Box

Request from Warren County Dispatch 513-695-2525. 8 Power Cells, each capable of charging 2 Android or Apple devices at a time; 4 total charges. Power Bank with 12 USB ports (requires external power) to charge the power cells or extra devices. The portable batteries will fit in your pocket and the cord is long enough that you can still use the phone while it is charging. This is especially useful when an emergency happens at the end of a shift and people's phone batteries are normally low.
