## Have a New Public Safety Team Member?

The WCPNS User Form should be completed for new staff of any law enforcement or fire/EMS department that utilizes Warren County Public Safety Network products & services. This replaces the PAMR form and better aligns with how our partners have begun using Telecom's Help Desk for deactivations/terminations. ## WINDOWS and MOBILE DATA COMPUTERS/LAPTOPS

It is time to start thinking about Mobile Data Computer /MDC (*Mobile Data Computer - Any mobile device with a Windows OS (operating system) that connects to the PSN (Public Safety Network) via VPN (Netmotion)*) and their future with the upcoming Windows 11. The end date for Telecom's use of Windows 10 will be July 31, 2025. We will not begin Windows 11 installation until 2025. With Windows 11, there are restrictions coming from Microsoft that cannot be upgraded on existing hardware. As it stands, the CF-19, CF-31, CF-20 MK 1, CF33-MK 1, and the G1 are not supported by the Windows 11 processor requirement. Current models that support upgrading to Windows 11 are CF-20 Mk2, CF-33 Mk2 FZ-55, G2 Surface pro's 6, 7, 8. I will be following up with individual department emails containing MDC lists of what is and isn't supported.

## Motorola APX Radio | Distribution to FIRE and LAW have begun

Last year, the Warren County Commissioner's approved all County owned Motorola XTS portable radios to be replaced with Motorola APX 6000 series radios. This allows Telecom to take older radios, that have been in the field for approximately 10 years, and replace them with radios with new features and new technologies to help both police and fire departments get the most out of our County wide 800MHz radio system.



## GoCyber Collective | Telecom Presentation

Telecom was honored to be asked to present our Patching Program at the GoCyber Collective to demonstrate patching for our network devices. Patch management protects against vulnerabilities by applying updates to software, drivers, applications and firmware that are susceptible to cyberattacks. Patch management also ensures your software and applications are kept up-to-date and run smoothly, supporting system uptime, and also helps ensure the best operating performance of systems, boosting productivity. This process helps organizations reduce security risks.



## MARCS TOW (Tower on wheels) | Telecom invested

Early in August, Telecom's Radio Unit (CHARLIE) members - Tommy Kramer and Steve Jennison, along with Community Manager Lisa Hicks - went downtown Cincinnati to watch the Cincinnati Fire Department activate a MARCS Tower on Wheels (TOW) for the event at Yeatman's Cove on the river. As we all know, communication is a primary tool during rescue jobs and without it, first responders cannot do their jobs to the fullest. The TOW is necessary to provide connection in rural areas or even highly populated areas during large events like these, or emergencies. So, the purpose of the activation was to increase the cities capability (within a small geographical footprint) for the potential need to add additional subscribers within the event command structure. This was a great opportunity to give task unit CHARLIE experience with watching the TOW being set up, in the event that Warren County were to need to deploy one, they would have knowledge and be able to assist with the set up. ## SCAM OF THE MONTH: Active Scams on Inactive Accounts

Recently, Google announced a change to its inactive account policies. Starting in December 2023, accounts that have been inactive for two or more years will start to get deleted. While this policy is meant to enhance security, cybercriminals could use this news for their phishing scams.

In the coming months, we expect to see an influx of phishing scams based on Google's new policies. Cybercriminals may send you phishing emails claiming that your Google account will be deleted unless you take immediate action. They may also ask you for your Google login credentials.

If your login credentials fall into the wrong hands, cybercriminals could steal your sensitive information or impersonate you to scam others.

Follow the tips below to spot similar scams:

- If you receive an email claiming that your account will be deleted, consider whether or not you use the account in question and verify the legitimacy of the email.
- Think before you click. Cyberattacks are designed to catch you off guard and trigger you to click impulsively.

Be cautious before logging in to accounts through an email link. Instead, navigate to the organization's official website to log in.

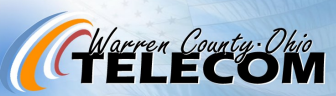

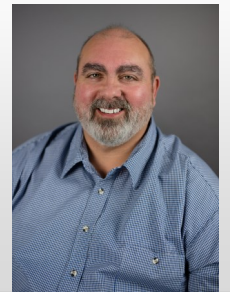

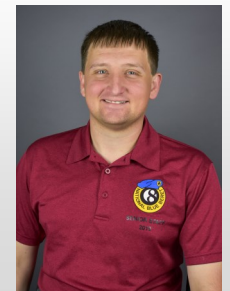
