ARREST CARDS

Clearance Code Cleared By Arrest-Adult	Clearance Code - Date Cleared 06/29/2024

- Did you just close your "offense report" with a Clearance Code of **CLEARED BY ARREST**?
- Did you complete an accompanying "arrest report" with it? A little more than half of you did not do one at all.

"Why do an arrest report? I didn't take him to jail"

1. Your Chief needs the number of arrests! Countless times we get contacted to run statistical records. If no one enters an arrest report, those arrests are not available for the count. Reports can only be pulled for the information entered.
2. State of Ohio OIBRS reports validation rules state that if you clear an incident by arrest then you must have that arrest attached to the reports when the file is sent. Below is the error.

ERROR MESSAGES

1. If Data Element #5 (Case Clearance) is F=Cleared by Arrest - Adult, G=Cleared by Arrest - Juvenile, there must be an accompanying Arrestee Segment.

3. Your records staff, or the person who is responsible for reporting to the State is spending countless hours completing this task for you.

Next time you close your report by arrest, hit the copy button at the bottom of the report and create an arrest card. This way the Jail has the information and can be waiting on you and your suspect. Your arrest is attached to the case file and your report is complete!

WINDOWS and MOBILE DATA COMPUTERS/LAPTOPS— Recommendation Tech Bulletin is updating soon!

It is time to start thinking about Mobile Data Computer/MDC (MDC – any mobile device with a Windows OS (operating system) that connects to the PSN (Public Safety Network) via VPN (Netmotion)) and their future with the upcoming Windows 11.

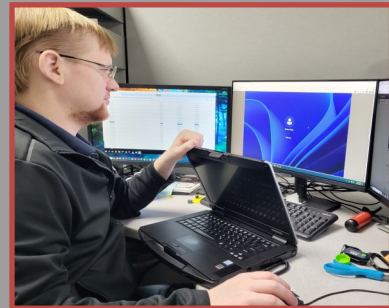
The end date for Telecom's use of Windows 10 will be July 31, 2025.

We will not begin Windows 11 installation until 2025. With Windows 11, there are restrictions coming from Microsoft that cannot be upgraded on existing hardware.

As it stands, the CF-19, CF-31, CF-20 MK 1, CF33-MK 1, and the G1 are not supported by the Windows 11 processor requirement. Current models that support upgrading to Windows 11 are CF-20 Mk2, CF-33 Mk2 FZ-55, G2 Surface pro's 6, 7, 8. I will be following up with individual department emails containing MDC lists of what is and isn't supported.

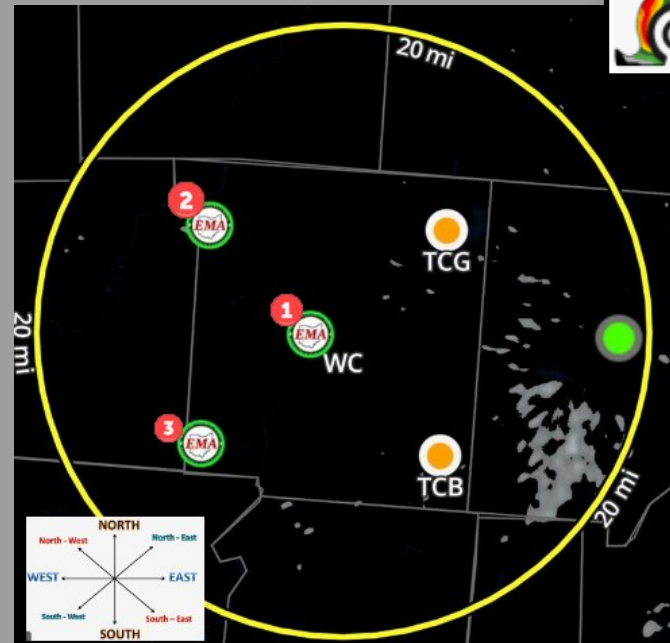

Tower Site Maintenance – Weather Station Installation

Telecom's Infrastructure Systems Unit installed the 3rd of 5 Weather Station Systems in conjunction with already scheduled tower maintenance, at our Snider Tower (see below RadarOmega image of the south-western corner of the county). These Weather Stations will automatically measure, record and transmit weather data. They also are used by Telecom, Warren County EMA and several other Warren County Departments are available to the public via the *Radar Omega application* available via the app stores.

Did you know? TELECOM's Data System's Analyst 1, Tommy Kramer, was a Corrections Officer at the Butler County Sheriff's Office from January 2018 until June 2022, where he worked in one of nine pods or housing units throughout the facility. On a normal day, he would be responsible for around 90 inmates in his housing unit. He took care of everything from cell inspections, meal passes, laundry change outs, to various other day-to-day activities inside the housing unit.

He started working in the Butler County Jail with just a high school diploma. However, between 2020 and 2022, he earned an associate's degree in Business Management and Cyber Security, all while working the night shift and taking online classes. This experience allowed Tommy to get his foot into BRICS (Radio division) of the Sheriff's Office.

Tommy's followed in the footsteps of his late father, retired Road Patrol Sergeant, Benjamin R. Kramer (2/21/1976—6/11/2023). Tommy's passion for advocacy and in making a difference was something he saw his father take great pride in. Tommy wanted to work at the Sheriff's Office because that's where his father spent the majority of his career before retiring in 2013.

Because of his past experience, being exposed to his father's profession in Law Enforcement, along with his work experience as a Corrections Officer, Tommy has brought great attributes of mental agility, critical thinking and sound judgement to his role at TELECOM!
