

### Intended Audience: All Users of Warren County TAC Channels

#### Overview

- Warren County has “83 TAC 2” through “83 TAC 21”, designed for use when two or more agencies are working on an incident.
- These are trunked talkgroups that operate off Warren County towers or MARCS towers in our adjacent Counties; so that when used in neighboring counties, they are reliable.
- TACs are part of WC’s interoperability package, allowed in adjacent county radios for purpose of mutual aid.
- Warren County Communications Center is responsible for assigning TACs in a skip-a-TAC manner, leaving room for incident expansion.
- 19 fire/EMS related incidents automatically get a TAC communicated at initial dispatch.
- TAC17 is earmarked for mutual aid incidents in Franklin.
- TAC19 is earmarked for mutual aid incidents in Lebanon.
- Warren County utilizes a new set of encrypted talkgroups, LAW1, LAW2, and LAW3 for law enforcement-only mutual aid. If outside agency communication is necessary, a TAC will be patched, eliminating the encryption.

#### Info for Neighboring Agencies

Since increasing our quantity of TACs from 12 to 20, it is permitted for neighboring counties to use our TACs within their jurisdiction when our agencies are assisting, or in an extreme emergency. This is why our TACs roam onto neighboring county MARCS towers, ensuring coverage. A TAC should be requested from the Warren County Communications Center (513-695-2525 or via Primary talkgroup).

#### TAC 2-21 are Different from SW MATACs 1-28

Southwest Mutual Aid TACs (SW MATACs) roam statewide and were created as a solution for agencies who don’t want to house neighboring county talkgroups in their radios; simplifying templates and navigation. However, they understand the sporadic need to communicate with neighboring Counties. MATACs also solve the problem of non-adjacent agencies being able to interoperate in a large-scale emergency (e.g. a Hamilton County agency and Wayne Twp Fire who don’t routinely mutual aid with each other). The hosting dispatch center is responsible to establish any necessary patches/joins.
